AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER RE: SMALL CLAIMS TRIALS, ETC. AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 20.22

The Ventura Superior Court is committed to protecting the health and safety of jurors, attorneys, staff, law enforcement, other court users, judges and the general public, while continuing to perform its constitutional and statutory duties. Beginning on March 14, 2020, the Presiding Judge issued several Emergency Orders closing the court for non-essential services to protect the health and safety of the public and court personnel. Over the past twenty-one months the court has implemented various protocols designed to protect the health and safety of all court users and personnel in response to the Covid-19 pandemic.

To continue to protect the health of court users, pursuant to article VI, section 1 of the state Constitution, Code of Civil Procedure section 128, Government Code section 68070, California Rules of Court, rule 10.603, and the inherent powers of the Court (*In re Reno* (2012) 55 Cal. 4th 428, 522), and in compliance with federal, state and local public health guidance,

THEREFORE THE COURT HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Until further notice all **Small Claims Trials** are heard at the East County Courthouse located at 3855-F Alamo Street, Simi Valley, California 93063.

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2. The clerk's office at the East County Courthouse in Simi Valley is closed and all Small Claims documents must be filed at the Hall of Justice, 800 S. Victoria Avenue, Ventura, California 93009.

3. A party to a Small Claims case may seek to appear remotely at trial by way of CourtCall. To do so, the party must pre-register with CourtCall at www.courtcall.com or by calling 888-882-6878. No less than 10 court days before the scheduled trial date, a party who seeks to appear by CourtCall must file at the Hall of Justice a *Notice of Remote Appearance* (Judicial Council Form RA-010) ("*Notice*") and must notify the opposing party(ies) that the party intends to appear by CourtCall. (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 3.672(h(2)(C)). Such notice may be made in writing (including through the use of the *Notice*), by email, by telephone, or in person.

- 4. A party who seeks to appear at trial by CourtCall and who intends to introduce an exhibit(s) at trial must: (1) provide a copy of the exhibit(s) to the opposing party(ies) no less than 10 court days prior to the trial and (2) submit the original exhibit(s) to the court at least 7 court days prior to the trial. Failure to comply with these requirements may result in a trial continuance.
- 5. A party receiving notice that another party(ies) intends to appear remotely at trial may serve and file no less than 5 court days before the trial an *Opposition to Remote Proceedings at Evidentiary Hearing or Trial* (Judicial Council Mandatory Form RA-015) ("*Opposition*"). (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 3.672(h(3)). The court will determine whether the party seeking to appear remotely may do so and will notify the parties of the court's determination. A party receiving notice that another party(ies) intends to appear remotely at trial may also elect to appear remotely by following the steps outlined in paragraph 3 and 4 no fewer than 5 court days before the hearing.
- 6. A party who: (a) will appear at trial <u>in person</u>; (b) intends to introduce an exhibit(s) at trial; and (c) has received notice that another party(ies) seeks to appear by CourtCall must provide a copy of the exhibit(s) to the party(ies) seeking to appear by CourtCall no later than 5 court days prior to the scheduled trial date. This obligation applies whether or not

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the party elects to file an *Opposition* to the request to appear by CourtCall. Providing the exhibits ahead of time to the party who seeks to appear by CourtCall ensures that the trial can go forward as scheduled if the court grants the request for a remote appearance.

- 7. For exhibit(s) that consist of <u>no more than</u> 10 total pages (inclusive of all exhibits), a party intending to appear at trial by CourtCall must email the exhibits to the court at SCtrials@ventura.courts.ca.gov. E-mails sent to SCtrials@ventura.courts.ca.gov are to consist only of exhibits. Any other e-mails will not be considered by the assigned judge and will be deleted without any action being taken. For exhibits that consist of <u>more than</u> 10 total pages (inclusive of all exhibits), a party intending to appear at trial by CourtCall must place the original exhibits in a sealed envelope in the drop box located outside the Hall of Justice at 800 S. Victoria Avenue, Ventura. The drop box is available from 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m. only, Monday through Friday, except holidays. The envelope must be labeled with the case name, case number and hearing date.
- 8. All Small Claims De Novo Appeals are heard in the assigned courtroom at the Hall of Justice, 800 S. Victoria Avenue, Ventura, California 93009. Personal appearance at the hearing is required. The court lacks current technology to support remote appearance. Parties must bring their exhibits to the hearing.
- Parties must appear in person for Judgment Debtor Examinations at the East County Courthouse. The court lacks current technology to support remote appearance.
- 10. Parties on a **Return on a Bench Warrant** or **Voluntary Surrender** must appear in person at the Civil Clerk's office at the Hall of Justice in Ventura. The court lacks current technology to support remote appearance.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE AND MAY BE AMENDED OR REVOKED, AS CIRCUMSTANCES REQUIRE.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
