25	(hereinafter "Notice") which includes the instructions for remote appearances and must be
26	served on the responding party. The Notice is incorporated herein and made a part of this

order. The Notice is available on the court's website at <u>www.ventura.courts.ca.gov</u> and shall remain in effect, until further order of the court.

All parties and counsel are prohibited from providing the Zoom address(es) to any third party. Only parties and counsel will be allowed into the Zoom hearing. All public and non-confidential proceedings are available through live stream at <a href="http://www.ventura.courts.ca.gov/live\_stream.html">http://www.ventura.courts.ca.gov/live\_stream.html</a>.

There shall be no recording of any of the court proceedings, other than by the assigned official court reporter. Any unofficial recording of the court proceedings held by video or teleconference, including screen shots or any other form of audio or visual recording is strictly prohibited without prior permission of the judicial officer presiding over the matter.

If a party is unable to appear by Zoom the party must appear in person and follow the procedure set out on the Notice.

THIS ORDER SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT, UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE AND MAY BE AMENDED OR REVOKED, AS CIRCUMSTANCES REQUIRE. IT IS SO ORDERED.
