On the Judicial Branch Home page you can access forms that may be completed on-line or you may print blank forms to be completed by hand.

Some forms are required to be used by all superior courts in California. These forms include "Adopted for Mandatory Use" in the lower left corner. The site also includes "approved" or optional forms, which must be accepted by all California courts. You will see "Form Approved for Optional Use" in the lower left corner of these forms.

"Form Packets" includes the necessary state and local forms, as well as instructions, for a variety of court actions. These can be filled out online or printed for completion by hand.
