DO NOT GIVE OUT THE ZOOM ADDRESS TO ANYONE. Only the party / attorney will be allowed into the Zoom meeting.

AT THE HEARING:

 if you are allowed to appear by Zoom. This may take some time as
 there are many cases scheduled at the same time. You may be
 asked to wait until a specified time.

- You MUST serve all your papers timely before your hearing. You will
 not be able to give the judge any new documents such as a picture,
 declaration, letter, etc., at the hearing.
- Witnesses will not be allowed for a hearing unless at the discretion of the judicial officer.
- You should have available all the papers you have filed, and the papers the other side has given you, for your hearing.
