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EFILE TRANSCRIPT OVERVIEW - Version 15

Effective 1/1/18 CRC 8.144 and CCP 271 changes to transcripts

Must be in electronic format (except where paper requested)

Paper and electronic transcripts must match in format

FORMAT OVERVIEW:

- 1. Paginated chronologically from cover through index, transcript and cert (Arabic #s only 1, 2, 3)
- 2. Index for each volume including separate page for Sessions, Witnesses, Exhibits
- 3. Index: For specific volume only (do not list pages from another volume)
- 4. Certificate for each volume
- 5. Volume may include multiple dates only if same judge and reporter

EACH VOLUME COVER:

- 1. Page #, case #, case name
- 2. Court #, judge, names of appellate counsel and addresses (or counsel present if not an appeal)
- 3. Volume # and total Volumes (1 of 9), inclusive page #s for that volume and cert (1-153)
- 4. Dates of all proceedings in specific volume

APPEAL VOLUMES:

- 1. Pages estimates due to coordinator by 5 days after notice of appeal
- 2. Coordinator to assign blocks of pages to each volume (prefer increments of 50)
 - a. Ex: Vol. 1 is 43 pages assigned 1-50. Vol. 2 is 25 pages assigned 51-100
 - b. No volume can exceed 300 pages. Last volume does not need to be blocked
- 3. EACH Reporter produces own volume. Print, bind and stamp. Print copies to coord with ASCII
 - a. Volume 1 to remain unbound until coordinator has final index from YesLaw

INDEX:

- 1. Sessions index must be included in EVERY transcript hearing, sentencing, motion, appeal, etc
- 2. Each index on separate page Sessions, Witness Chrono, Exhibits
- 3. "MASTER INDEX VOLUME #" at top of each index page
- 4. Two spaces between exhibit number and description (No hyphen)
- 5. After transcript uploads to YesLaw, coordinator prints master index and attaches to Vol. 1

LAST PAGES OF VOLUME:

- 1. If fewer pages in transcript than assigned, must include blurb: (There are no pages 44-50. The next volume and page number is Volume 2, page 51.)
- 2. If more pages in transcript than assigned, use hyphenated page numbers to end of transcript. (50, 50-1, 50-2, 50-3, etc). No blurb necessary at end of transcript.
- 3. Certificate must be included at end of every volume, digitally and electronically signed
- 4. Page number on certificate

ASCII FILE LABEL:

1. Include name of party, type of transcript, Volume #, RT, date or dates of transcript mmddyyyy.

APPEAL FORMATS - VENTURA SUPERIOR COURT

Revised January 30, 2019

COVERS AND INDEXES

- All covers and index pages are numbered (except master index printed from YesLaw)
- All pages have line numbers including covers and index and cert
- Order of covers is Appeal cover, Sessions Index, Witness Index, Exhibits Index, Daily Cover, Transcript, Cert. If there are no witnesses or exhibits, you do not need to add these pages.
- Underlining and/or bold print (if you use) is not supported by electronic filing so is not necessary EXCEPT the underline for the caption box and the line above your name on the cert page which is described in another section
- Each date and reporter is a separate volume. Multiple consecutive dates can be included in one volume <u>only</u> if all dates have the same judge and reporter
- Each volume will have its own index specific to that volume
- The first volume needs to have a master index in addition to the index for that volume. YesLaw (or other vendor) creates a master index and attaches to electronic copy. However, for paper copy you will need to print this off YesLaw and insert into the first volume. Do not number the master index printed from YesLaw
- No hyphens may be used for incorrectly numbered pages on covers or index. Hyphens can be added at the end of the transcript if you go over your blocked number of pages.

APPEAL COVER

- Case No. and B No. are on the top line
- There is **NO** blank line between the "---o0o---" and the caption
- Volume Numbers and Page numbers for that volume go to the right of the birdcage instead of at the bottom of the page. Indicate the actual number of pages, including cert page, in your transcript, not the pages you were blocked.
- The line at the bottom of the birdcage needs to be manually typed in (Shift + repeated hyphen) instead of a format through your software
- Insert judge's name for your date on the Appeal Cover as opposed to the judge being appealed from (Might be the same judge)
- If you are putting multiple dates in one volume, make sure to include all dates on the cover (Please remember that if you have different judges, they have to be separate volumes

VOLUME INDEX - Includes Sessions, witnesses, exhibits

- There will always be at least a Sessions index in every volume
- Must state "MASTER INDEX VOLUME (#)" at the top of each index page
- Each index must be on its own page

A. SESSIONS INDEX

- Must include the heading "SESSIONS" plural
- Must include the date with which session (A.M. or P.M.) underneath
- Numbers in the page column must align with the session and any proceedings listed, NOT the date of the session (see sample transcript)
- When including a Marsden or sealed proceeding on an index, give the page number where the blurb is located within the transcript and not the actual page the sealed proceeding begins on (See sample transcript)

B. WITNESS INDEX

- Must have a chronological index. Alphabetical is done by YesLaw (or other vendor)
- Witness names are listed by first and then last name (See sample index)
- No commas between names or titles (See sample index)
- Witness names all capped
- Examinations must be in paragraph format and can no longer be in table format. (See sample index)
- Make sure page numbers align with the examination line

C. EXHIBITS INDEX

- There needs to be at least two spaces between exhibit number and the description. No dashes (see sample transcript)
- Page numbers need to align with the exhibit number and the first description line so that hyperlinks will be made correctly

DAILY COVER

- Underline on birdcage must be manually typed in (Shift + repeated hyphen)
- Must have page number
- It is not necessary to list type of proceedings. "REPORTER'S TRANSCRIPT OF PROCEEDINGS" is acceptable on appeal daily covers
- Appearances Move all the way to left margin. (See sample transcript)

SEALED/CONFIDENTIAL PROCEEDINGS

- A sealed record is that which has been sealed by Order of the Court.
 A confidential record is that which is required by statute or case law to be sealed, i.e., Marsden motion, Pitchess motion, juvenile hearings.
- Sealed/confidential proceedings are always in a separate volume.
 Sealed proceedings become a separate volume by adding a letter to the volume number. Example: If you are Volume 4 and have a Marsden, the Marsden would become Volume 4A.
- Sealed/confidential proceedings must be designated as being sealed or confidential. See Tab 4 for samples and exact language on covers per CRC 8.45(c)(1)(B) and (C)
- Use the Daily Cover from the sealed transcript on the outside of envelope. Add the B Number, Volume number, and page numbers to this cover. (See Tab 4C)
- All sealed/confidential proceedings are filed under separate seal but are now numbered consecutively. Do not assign or estimate a separate block of pages for sealed proceedings. They are inclusive in the block for the regular coinciding volume
- Sealed/confidential proceedings must have its own cert. The cert must have a page number. Do not include the hyphenated blocked page number on this cert. Rather, the hyphenated page number goes on the cert for the coinciding regular volume.
- Sealed/confidential proceedings can oftentimes be a stand-alone proceeding with nothing on the record before or after. If you have only sealed proceedings with no other proceedings before or after, it is labeled as the "A" volume. The normal coinciding volume would include the appeal cover, sessions index, daily cover, the sealed

proceedings blurb on its own page, and cert. (See Tab 3A)

- If there are proceedings before the sealed portion, a blurb must be placed in the transcript where the sealed proceedings take place stating the page numbers of the sealed proceedings and the next page number if proceedings resume in open court after the sealed portion. Resumed proceedings will start on a new page. You will have to change the page number so that it follows the last page of the sealed portion. Example: Your blurb is on page 4. Sealed portion starts at page 5 and ends with cert on page 10. Your next page number for resumed proceedings in open court will be 11. No new cover or dateline needed. Begin new page with a blurb on line 1 stating "(Proceedings resumed in open court.)" (See Tab 3B)
- If proceedings do not resume after the sealed portion, you would add the end-of-volume blurb stating what the next volume and page number will be (See Tab 3C)
- Sealed/confidential proceedings must be included on the Sessions indexes of both the appeal volume and corresponding "A" volume
 - a. Appeal Index Indicate Sealed or Confidential Proceedings/Hearing followed by "May Not Be Examined Without Court Order." Include the page numbers of the sealed proceedings. Do not disclose the substance of the hearing, i.e., Marsden Motion, Pitchess Motion. In the page number column use the number of the page where the blurb is located within the transcript indicating there is a sealed portion instead of the actual page the sealed proceeding begins on. (See sample indexes in Tabs 3A, 3B, 3C)
 - b. Sealed volume index Indicate Sealed or Confidential Proceedings/Hearing followed by "May Not Be Examined Without Court Order" (See overview and samples in Tab 4)

- Sealed/confidential proceedings have to be uploaded seperately on YesLaw. Make sure you give the coordinator a separate ASCII file for the sealed proceedings. Refer to the Transcript Production/ASCII section of the guidelines on how to label sealed ASCIIs. When uploading to YesLaw, make sure to select "sealed/confidential" on the drop down box for type of proceedings.
- Transmission of Sealed/Confidential Transcripts (Envelopes)
 - a. If all parties are present, each copy goes in its own envelope, i.e., Court, DA, defense present three envelopes
 - b. If one party is not present, original and one copy in one envelope and one copy in another envelope, i.e., Marsden, Court and Defense present - two envelopes
 - c. Exception: Hobbs Motions or any motion under Evidence Code 1041 or 1042 (unsealing search warrants/confidential informants), ALL copies in one envelope.

TRANSCRIPT BODY

- See sample transcripts for dateline format
- All pages are to be numbered consecutively
- Delete all headers and footers (YesLaw adds them)
- If your transcript exceeds the block of pages you were given, you must add a -1, -2, etc, to your last assigned page number. For example: If you were assigned pages 1-50 and you have 52 pages, you must number them 50-1 and 50-2.
- At the end of your transcript (before your cert page) you must

include a blurb (per CRC 8.144) stating what the next volume and page number will be. Do not forget to add a page for your cert when giving next page number. (See example in the sample transcript for exact wording of blurb). You do not have to include this blurb if you have no blank pages in your transcript or if you are the last volume.

REPORTER'S CERT

- All volumes must have a cert
- Certs must have a page number
- Remove the clause at the bottom of cert regarding Government Code (if you use that). We may be adding a new one.
- Certs have to be electronically and digitally signed
- If your transcript has fewer pages than what was assigned to you, then you will have to include the assigned number with your cert page number. Ex: Your cert is page 277 but you were blocked pages 1-300, your cert page number will be 277-300. (See sample transcript)
- You must manually underline the birdcage and the line above the reporter's name
- Follow wording of the sample cert so that we are all consistent

TRANSCRIPT PRODUCTION/ASCIIs

- Until we completely switch over to e-filing, we still need to print 0+2
- Bind and stamp your volumes before giving to coordinator (except for Volume 1. It will need the master index added to it before binding)
- Original must have the cover on cardstock paper (hard copy)
- Provide an ASCII of your date/dates to the coordinator
- Name your job on the ASCII using the following format: Lastname Appeal.Vol-1.RT.091718
 Ex: Smith Appeal.Vol-1.RT.091718
- If you have multiple dates in one volume, label the ASCII the same way with a period between each date.

Ex: Smith Appeal.Vol-1.RT.091718.091818.091918

• When labeling the sealed ASCIIs use the same format adding the "A" to the volume number. If you have more than one sealed portion for the same date, use consecutive letters.

Ex: Smith Appeal.Vol-1A.RT.091718

Ex: Smith Appeal.Vol-1B.RT.091718

GENERAL CRIMINAL TRANSCRIPTS (Prelims, Change of Pleas, Motions, etc.)

- Move Case No. to top line
- No blank line between "---o0o---" and caption
- Include Volume No. even if it's only one volume
- Include title of Proceedings on Cover (see example covers)
- Include Sessions index and witness/exhibit index if applicable
- All pages numbered
- All pages have line numbers

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



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

Text File Transcript Formats and YesLaw

November 30, 2017

Introduction

This document includes recommendations for court reporter's transcript text/ASCII files such that they process more efficiently through the YesLaw software. The YesLaw software automatically reads the transcript caption and index pages and parses the case name, case or cause number, proceeding date and index contents. If the software does not auto-determine these values correctly, you may manually enter and override the software determined values. But manual entry takes additional time and is prone to typos. Some simple changes to your transcript will help the software correctly parse the transcript Meta data eliminating the need for manual entry. So one small change to your standard transcript format can make transcript processing more efficient.

In California, the multiple reporter volumes within a case are merged into a single "master volume" for appeals. The master volume includes comprehensive bookmarks, a hyperlinked word index and a single, hyperlinked "master index" including Sessions, Examinations (both chronological and alphabetical), and Exhibits combined from all of the individual volumes. To provide a more consistent look within the merged master volume, the different reporter transcript formats were standardized. The reporters preparing transcript volumes for a given case are not guaranteed to be on the same CAT software so the Fresno reporters prepared matching software templates or layouts for the different CAT softwares (Case Catalyst, Eclipse and StenoCat) for both 26 and 28 lines-per-page.

The Fresno reporters have been using the YesLaw software for over several years and have helped to improve the automation algorithms. But the algorithms are based on their standardized transcript format. Although use of these CAT software templates is not necessarily required, use may make transcript processing more efficient – less manual intervention will be required.

ASCII (Text) File Export Format from CAT Software

Importing a transcript into the YesLaw software begins by exporting a transcript from the CAT software to a text or ASCII format. Export the transcript in a Summation/AMICUS format or "Page Formatted ACII" format. Do include page numbers and line numbers. The page numbers should be located in the upper right of each and every page. No pages should be unnumbered. Do not include any other header or footer content – just the page number. Do not suspend the page numbering on your front matter pages of certificate page – the page number should be on each and every page.

Volume Numbering

Each volume is typically produced by a single court reporter. That volume may comprise multiple days but only if the one court reporter covers all the proceedings during those days. If another court reporter covers a session, there must be a change in volumes with the change in reporters. If two reporters have teamed up to handle dailies for a trial where one reporter covers the morning session and another reporter handles the afternoon session, it is possible for these two transcripts to be merged into a single transcript volume for the day (a single Volume 1), however it may be easier to simply have separate volumes perhaps named Volume 1A and 1B.

If a Marsden motion is taken requiring the testimony to be sealed or treated differently (confidential and bound under separate cover), the testimony is separated into a different volume. If the testimony for that day was Volume 1, then the Marsden motion breakout would be named Volume 1A to indicate it was otherwise recorded within the same day as Volume 1. Multiple motions spread throughout the day might be named Volume 1A, 1B, 1C...

Reporters sometimes number their volumes with Roman numerals (I, II, III...), but a mix of Roman and Arabic numerals (1, 2, 3...) within a case would be awkward and not consistent. And Roman numerals for cases with many volumes is cumbersome. Volume XXXIV is simply not as intuitive as Volume 34. So standardize on numbering your volumes with Arabic numerals.

Page Numbering

Consistent Arabic volume numbering is sometimes troubling for reporters, but page numbering has proven to be the most difficult hurdle.

Court transcripts might begin with any page number. When block numbering is used, second transcript volumes might begin on page 101 or 301. So even though it is the first page within the electronic file, the page label might be 101 or 301. And transcript volumes may have page ranges extracted to a separate file if requested to be sealed by the court (e.g. Marsden Motions). So the page label will be different from the number of the physical pages from the beginning of the file. But to allow quick and easy navigation to a particular page, users should be able to enter 321 and jump directly to the proper page 321 even if it is the just 21st page within a transcript file. So each page label must match the page number. See *Requirement 2* of the 5th DCA's *Electronic Reporter Transcript List of Requirements* dated March 21, 2016.

When viewing transcripts within Adobe Acrobat or Acrobat Reader, the pages are required be identified or labeled by the proper page number. Some PDF files are created such that the first page is always identified as 1. With page number gaps (e.g. Marsden Motions, confidential portions), if the pages are not identified with the correct page numbering, navigating to a page or printing a page range can be difficult. Page numbering is also important when printing a range of pages within a transcript. A transcript user trying to print pages 325 through 327 should be able to simply enter the page range 325 to 327.

The second page numbering requirement is that every page be numbered starting from the first, cover page (*Requirement 3*). Although it has been common practice in some courts to not number the first few pages – the caption and index pages – this makes printing of these few pages difficult. If a page does not have a page number label, one cannot simply enter the page number or page number range for printing. There is no page number to enter.

The page number should be shown on every page PDF page. Even though a page number is allocated for a page, for appearances of cover pages, the display of the page number is sometimes suspended. In their requirements, the court has asked that not only every page be

numbered, but the page number appear on every page.

Pagination

The YesLaw software attempts to determine the page number of each page. If the transcript does not include a page number on each page of the imported text file, or if the pages simply do not have page number, the software may put the contents of what should be multiple pages onto a single page.

26 or 28 Lines per Page

The YesLaw software supports 25, 26, 28 and other lines-per-page. Most California deposition reporters produce transcripts with 25 lines-per-page whereas most California official reporters produce transcripts with 26 or 28 lines per page. The YesLaw software adapts to different lines per page within the imported ASCII file – no software configuration will be required. However, the software works better if line numbers are used on every page although this is not an absolute requirement. Also line numbers should be in the same column for consistency.

Order of Transcript Content

An appeals court transcript should begin with page 1 as the appeals caption page – plaintiffs versus defendants set off within a "birdcage." The superior court caption page should immediately follow the appeals court caption page. An appearances page may follow if not included at the bottom of the caption page. Next should be the index of examinations including the dates and sessions (e.g. morning and afternoon) covered with major milestones indicated beneath the date. An index of witness and examinations is next followed by an index of exhibits. The testimony follows the index of exhibits.

- 1. Appeals Court Caption Page
- 2. Superior Court Caption Page
- 3. Appearances Page (optional, often included on caption page)
- 4. Sessions Index (Date followed by morning and afternoon session and session events)
- 5. Examinations Index (Chronological Order)
- 6. Exhibits Index
- 7. Proceedings
- 8. Court Reporter's Certificate Page

Case Names

The case name is read from the court reporter's transcript and is typically shortened to either People vs John Garnett or Department vs John G. The software attempts to do this automatically, however manual corrections may be required. To correct, click in the case box and correct the existing text.

Case or Cause Number

The case number should be included on the caption page preceded by "Case No." or just "No." But note the special suggestion about *Department Numbers* below.

The case or cause number can be placed at the top of the caption page. As there may be any number of "People vs Smith" cases, the case number is the best way to unambiguously identify a particular case. Consistently putting the case number at the top of the caption page saves the user from having search around the caption page to find the case number. In the example below, not the Superior Court case number is listed top left and the Appeals case number is added top right.



Department Number

For larger court systems, transcripts often include a department number on the caption page. This department number identifies the individual courtroom. However, the YesLaw software may confuse the "Number" or "No." text for the case or cause number. So the case or cause number will be incorrectly parsed as the department number – the department number shows up in the Case/Cause No. box. The case or cause number would have to be manually corrected every time. But this is simply fixed by removing the "Number" or "No." text following "Department" so the transcript reads "Department 62" rather than "Department No. 62." Note in the example below how the department is identified as "Department 62."

Separating the Court, Judge and Department from the Case Caption

Occasionally the YesLaw software is confused by the court reporter's caption page format and the judge's name shows up in the parsed Case Name. One quick way to correct this issue is to include a "-o0o-" decoration after the top of the caption page where the county, court, judge and department is identified. This will separate the court, judge, and department from the case caption or "birdcage." See example below.



General Index Rules

When creating your index, do not include fill dots between the index item and the page number.

Do not enter page ranges within the index. If you include the Marsden Motion within the Sessions index, indicate the last page before the Marsden Motion rather than the page range or pages within the Marsden Motion.

Sessions/Hearing Index

A Sessions Index must include SESSIONS as the header (SESSION singular will not work). Even if the transcript includes only on session, the header must be the plural SESSIONS. Then each date is listed without a page number followed by the different morning and afternoon sessions with a page number. Sub items (hearings, etc.) may then be included beneath the morning and afternoon sessions with a page number.

Simple Sessions Index Sample

This version is the simplest SESSIONS index. Each date is provided *without* page number followed by the Morning and Afternoon Sessions with page numbers. The date must be included even if the volume covers only one date. If there were no Morning Session, it would not be listed. Do not put the hearing date on the same line as the "Page" column header. If the software is not picking up the sessions, confirm the date is spelled correctly and the year is complete. The software will not recognize the year "201" – the year must be a complete four digits.

Complex Sessions Index Sample

This version includes further details underneath the Morning and Afternoon sessions. The YesLaw software will provide bookmarks to each hearing or topic indented under each day's morning and afternoon session. The SESSIONS header is required. Each date should be provided without page number followed by the Morning or Afternoon Session with page numbers and optionally sub items under the Morning and Afternoon Sessions with page numbers.

Marsden Motions

Marsden Motions should be listed under the appropriate session. However a page number cannot be provided for the first page of the Marsden Motion as it is in a different transcript volume. Rather list the Marsden Motion followed by the page range of the Marsden Motion and list the corresponding page for the bookmark as the last page before the Marsden Motion. This will be the page where the "blurb" indicating that page range of the Marsden Motion is not included and the page where the transcript resumes.

In the example below, the Marsden Motion begins on page 905 and continues through 913. The bookmark page number is page 904 – the last page before the Marsden Motion.

Each SESSIONS entry should begin with the date followed by either MORNING SESSION or AFTERNOON SESSION (at a minimum). The date does not have a corresponding page number but the Morning and Afternoon Sessions do. Further events can be listed below the MORNING SESSION entry. The MORNING SESSION or AFTERNOON SESSION provides the bookmark for the beginning of the proceedings.

Complex Sessions Index Sample - Motions

In the example below, the SESSIONS index includes list of motions and the corresponding page number where introduced. The SESSIONS index can include any events to be bookmarked. Each item should be listed with a page number. But note only the text on the line with the page number will show as the bookmark. One common mistake is to put the line number on the last line of the item description. The software will bookmark and include in the Master Index only the line with the line number – and the beginning of the item description is best.

Index of Examinations

The Index of Examinations page should be titled with "Chronological Index of Witnesses" or "Witnesses in Chronological Order." The witness name can optionally be listed with "Witness for the People" or "Witness for the Defendant" added after the witness name. The line with the witness name should not have a page number to the right rather the first examination immediately below should have the page number where the examination begins. Several samples are provided, although the generally follow the same format with only small differences.



Witness Name Listing

When providing the witness name within the Examination Index do not include commas within the listing for witnesses with degrees or titles. List doctors as John Smith M.D. and not as John Smith, M.D. - note list without the comma. List as John Smith Jr. or John Smith III rather than John Smith, Jr. or John Smith, III. If you prefer to use the comma, the listing within the examination indices will have to be manually corrected.

Do not include a dash after the witness name followed by "Witness for the People" rather list the witness name and follow it with (Witness for the People) within parentheses. This will help differentiate a hyphenated last name from dashes to separate the witness from the witness description.

The supported format allows for the questioning attorney's name for each examination (e.g. By Mr. Wendricks). The table format does not support this option. In the example below, each witness is listed followed (as an option) by "(Witness for the People)" or "(Witness for the Defendant)."

In *Examinations Index Sample 4*, the examination listings are provided in lowercase letters making the witness names in ALL CAPS stand out. Notes regarding the witness (e.g. Resumed, Pursuant to Evidence Code 776, and Via Videotaped Deposition) are shown in lowercase letters and within parentheses following the witness name. The "Ph.D." is shown in mixed case as it looks odd in ALL CAPS. This last example seems the most visually pleasing.

An Exhibits Index must include EXHIBITS as the header. Then each exhibit is listed starting with the exhibit number/letter/number-letter combination followed by a description and the page where the exhibit was introduced. Should the description require more than one line to provide the description, the line number should be included on the first line (same as the exhibit number) and the abbreviated description contents of this line will be included as the bookmark – not the full description. So just the description on the same line as the exhibit and line number will be included in the bookmark listing.



Exhibits within the Master Index

Within the Master Index, the exhibits will be listed in numerical followed by alphabetical order.

So number exhibits will be listed first followed by the lettered exhibits. Only the first line of the exhibit description will be included – this must be the line with the page number(s). The line numbers cannot be on a different line than the exhibit number. Also there must be at least two spaces between the exhibit number and the exhibit description. So leave more than just one column of white space between the exhibit number column and description column.

Exhibits Index - Common Errors



The above sample exhibit index shows some common errors within the exhibits index. There is only one space between the exhibit number and the description. There must be a minimum of two spaces between the exhibit number and the description.

The page number is not on the same line as the exhibit number. The page number must be on same line as the exhibit number and only the text between the exhibit number and the page number will be included within the Master Index.

Certificate Page

Each transcript should include at least one certificate page as the last page within the transcript. If two reporters contributed to a single volume (think dailies), the transcript can be split into two volumes, for example a morning volume and an afternoon volume. Or the reporter transcripts can be merged into a single transcript and two certificate pages would be included at the very end of the transcript. Each certificate page would indicate the page number range(s) within the transcript the reporter is certifying.

The certificate page should include a line near the bottom for the reporter's signature. The software will automatically size the signature graphic to the width of the signature line. The signature line can be the same width of the text immediately below to create a neat, square signature block. The underline cannot be underline formatting within the CAT software as the text file exported does not support formatting (bold, italics, or underline text), rather the underline must be a series of underscores (Shift + hyphen).

ASCII File Naming Convention for Consistency

Fresno has standardized upon a single text file naming convention. For a case such as "People vs. John Q. Melendez," Fresno uses:

Melendez.Vol-1.RT.060415.txt or Last.Vol-#.RT.MMDDYY.txt

The "RT" is for "Reporter's Transcript" to differentiate the files from the clerk's transcript. For multiple dates, the first date is always listed and optionally extended with the additional dates (e.g. Melendez.Vol-1.RT.060415.060515.060815.txt). Putting the dates at the end allows the files to alphabetically sort into cases and then volumes more easily. So some thought was put into this naming convention.

For a Department of Social Services case such as "Department vs. John Q," Fresno uses:

JOHNQ.Vol-3.RT.042015.txt or FirstL.Vol-#.RT.MMDDYY.txt

California E-Filing

On Friday October 6, 2017, California Governor Jerry Brown signed Assembly Bill 1450 (see below) that, effective January 1, 2018, requires official and pro tempore court reporters to deliver transcripts in electronic form to any court, party or person entitled to the transcript, unless the party or person requests the transcript in paper form. Paper copy originals will be no longer be required. The electronic transcripts must meet the California Rules of Court requirements.

Exceptions

Prior to January 1, 2023, if the court is unable to use or store an electronic transcript, or if the court reporter is unable to provide an electronic transcript that meets the court requirements and provides advance notice of this inability, a paper copy original can still be filed. However an electronic copy can be requested within 120 days of the paper filing, the court reporter shall provide an electronic PDF transcript.

California 2017 Assembly Bill 1450 re Code of Civil Procedure Section 271

SECTION 1.

Section 271 of the Code of Civil Procedure is repealed.

SEC. 2.

Section 271 is added to the Code of Civil Procedure, to read:

271.

(a) An official reporter or official reporter pro tempore shall deliver a transcript in electronic form, in compliance with the California Rules of Court, to any court, party, or person entitled to the transcript, unless any of the following apply:

(1) The party or person entitled to the transcript requests the reporter's transcript in paper form.

- (2) Prior to January 1, 2023, the court lacks the technical ability to use or store a transcript in electronic form pursuant to this section and provides advance notice of this fact to the official reporter or official reporter pro tempore.
- (3) Prior to January 1, 2023, the official reporter or official reporter pro tempore lacks the technical ability to deliver a transcript in electronic form pursuant to this section and provides advance notice of this fact to the court, party, or person entitled to the transcript.
- (b) If a paper transcript is delivered in lieu of an electronic transcript described in subdivision (a), within 120 days of the official reporter or official reporter pro tempore filing or delivering the paper transcript, the official reporter or official reporter pro tempore shall provide, upon request, a copy of the original transcript in full text-searchable portable document format (PDF) if the proceedings were produced with computer-aided transcription equipment. The copy of the original transcript in full text-searchable PDF format shall not be deemed to be an original transcript.
- (c) Nothing in this section changes any requirement set forth in Section 69950 or 69954 of the Government Code, regardless of whether a transcript is delivered in electronic or paper form.
- (d) Except as provided in subdivision (b), an electronic transcript delivered in accordance with this section shall be deemed to be an original transcript for all purposes, including any obligation of an attorney to maintain or deliver a file to a client.
- (e) An electronic transcript shall comply with any format requirement imposed pursuant to subdivision (a). However, an official reporter or official reporter pro tempore shall not be required to use a specific vendor, technology, or software to comply with this section, unless the official reporter or official reporter pro tempore agrees with the court, party, or person entitled to the transcript to use a specific vendor, technology, or software. Absent that agreement, an official reporter or official reporter pro tempore may select the vendor, technology, and software to comply with this section and the California Rules of Court. In adopting transcript format requirements for the California Rules of Court, consideration shall be given on a technology-neutral basis to the availability of relevant vendors of transcript products, technologies, and software.
- (f) After January 1, 2023, if new or updated rule of court format requirements for electronic transcripts necessitate a significant change in equipment or software owned by official reporters or official reporters pro tempore, the official reporters and official reporters pro tempore shall be given no less than one year to comply with the format requirements. If the change is necessary to address a security issue, then a reasonable time shall be given to comply with the new format requirements.

Updated CA Rule 8.144 (November 2017)

To implement recent legislation (California 2017 Assembly Bill 1450) which enables court reporters to turn in transcripts in electronic form, the Appellate Advisory Committee recommended the Judicial Council update Rule 8.144 of the California Rules of Court which governs the format of reporters' transcripts. The update is to be approved at the Judicial Councils' meeting on this Friday, November 17. A summary of the requirements are provided below. Please read the entire Rule 8.144 text for details. The single-file, multivolume appeal and hyperlink requirements have been removed from the original requirements published for public comment earlier this year. Bookmarks, digital and electronic signatures, and numbering every page and line are still requirements.

Per updated Rule 8.144 (November 17, 2017), requirements for transcripts in electronic form...

Full-Text Searchable PDF Formatted (Rule 8.144 (d)(1)(C), (Rule 8.144 (d)(1)(A))

Transcripts must be in full-test searchable PDF (Portable Document Format) format or other searchable format approved by the court. It must not be created from a scanned document unless ordered by the court. (when electronic copies are no longer available, e.g. old transcripts)

Bookmarks (Rule 8.144 (d)(1)(D))

Transcripts must include bookmarks to each heading, subheading, and specified components of the transcript.

"Include an electronic bookmark to each heading and subheading; all sessions or hearings (date lines); all witness examinations where each witness's direct, cross, and any other examination begins; all indexes; and all exhibits where any exhibit is marked for identification and where it is admitted or refused. All bookmarks, when clicked, must retain the user's currently selected zoom settings."

Digitally and Electronically Signed (Rule 8.144 (d)(1)(E))

Be digitally and electronically signed by the court reporter, unless the court reporter lacks the technical ability to provide a digital signature, in which case only an electronic signature is required.

Copy and Paste (Rule 8.144 (d)(1)(F))

Transcripts must permit users to copy and paste, keeping the original formatting, but with headers, footers, line numbers, and page numbers excluded.

Permit Electronic Stamps (Rule 8.144 (d)(1)(G))

Permit courts to electronically add filed/received stamps.

Volumes (Rule 8.144 (b)(6))

Reporters' transcripts must be produced in volumes of no more than 300 pages. Volumes may contain more than one date, however the page count per volume should not exceed 300 pages. Single proceeding days should not be split into multiple volumes.

Covers (Rule 8.144 (b)(7))

The cover of each volume must state the title and trial court number of the case, the names of the trial court and each participating trial judge, the names and address of the appellate counsel for each party, the volume number, the total number of volumes in the transcript and the inclusive page numbers of that volume. The cover of each volume must state the dates of the proceedings reported in that volume.


Page Numbering (Rule 8.144 (b)(2)(D))

The pages must be consecutively numbered, except as provided in (f) [block numbering], beginning with volume one's cover as page 1 and continuing throughout the transcript, including the indexes, certificates, and cover pages for subsequent volumes, and using only Arabic numerals (i.e., 1, 2, 3).

Page Counter (Rule 8.144 (d)(1)(C))

Ensure that the electronic page counter in the PDF file viewer matches the transcript page numbering.

In the example shown below, the page counter (1010 in left circle) matches the page number within the document (1010 in right circle) even though it is the page 456 of the 617 pages within the document. Pages are missing due to block numbering and excerpted Marsden Motions.



Line numbering (Rule 8.144 (b)(3))

In the reporter's transcript the lines on each page must be consecutively numbered and must be double-spaced or one-and-a-half-spaced; double-spaced means three lines to a vertical inch.

Indexes (Rule 8.144 (b)(5)(B))

The reporter's transcript must contain, at the beginning of the first volume:

Alphabetical and chronological indexes listing the volume, where applicable, and page where each witness's direct, cross, and any other examination begins; and

index listing the volume, where applicable, and page where any exhibit is marked for identification and where it is admitted or refused. The index must identify each exhibit by number or letter and a brief description of the exhibit.

Each index must begin on a separate page. (Rule 8.144 (b)(5)(C))

Multivolume or Multireporter Transcripts (Rule 8.144 (d)(2))

In addition to the requirements in (1), for multivolume or multireporter transcripts delivered in electronic format, each individual reporter must provide a digitally and electronically signed certificate with his or her respective portion of the transcript. If the court reporter lacks the technical ability to provide a digital signature, then only an electronic signature is required.
